

TO: Delta Air Lines and Delta Connection Passengers:

SUBJECT: Guidelines to transport a Refrigerated Liquid Nitrogen (Dry Shipper)

Delta Air Lines will allow transporting of your liquid nitrogen dry shipper provided it is in accordance with the International Air Transportation Association (IATA) Dangerous Goods Regulation 2.3.4.3 which state:

2.3.4.3 Insulated Packages Containing Refrigerated Liquid Nitrogen (Dry Shipper)

Insulated packaging containing refrigerated liquid nitrogen fully absorbed in a porous material and intended for transport, at low temperature, of non-dangerous products are not subject to these Regulation provided the design of the insulated packaging would not allow the build-up of pressure within the container and would not permit the release of any refrigerated liquid nitrogen irrespective of the orientation of the insulated packaging.

You are able to carry your Dry Shipper container onto the aircraft as long as it conforms to the Delta Air Lines carry on baggage size regulation of 22" x 14" x 9" (or 56 x 36 x 23 cm).

When checking-in for your flights you need to notify the agent you are traveling with the Dry Shipper. The agent will need to do a visual check of the Dry Shipper to confirm it is not damaged and in good working condition.
